Bilateral consultations which the European Economic Community has held with the Faroe Islands, Norway and Sweden, respectively have resulted in the initialling of reciprocal bilateral fishery arrangements for 1983. These arrangements provide inter alia for certain catch quotas for Community vessels in the fishery zones of the other Parties.

The draft Regulations now proposed allocate the quotas for 1983 available to Community fishing vessels under the abovementioned arrangements between the interested Member States and refer to the appropriate control procedures which ensure that the allocations between Member States provided in these Regulations are respected.

The proposed allocations of the quotas available to the Community between Member States are based on the principles used for the allocation of the 1982 quotas.

Catches, under the Agree nent on mutual fishing rights in 1933between the Community and Norway, by vessels flying the flag of a Member State in the waters lilling within the Norwegian economic zone not of 62°N as well as within the fishery zone around Jan Mayen shall be limited for 1983 to the quote set out in Annex I.
- 2. Catches of the species mentioned in Annex II, under the Agreement on mutual fishing rights in 1983 between the Community and Norway, by vessels flying the flag of a Member State in the waters falling within the Norwegian economic zone and situated south of 62°N shall be limited for 1983to the quotas set out in the Annex.

Article 2

Member States and captains of fishing vessels flying the flag of a Member State shall, with regard to fishing in the waters referred to in Article I, comply with the provisions of Articles 3 to 9 of Council Regulation (EEC) No 2057/82 of 29 June 1982 establishing control measures for fishing activities by vessels of the Member States (3).

Article 3

This Regulation shall enter into force on the day of its publication in the Official Journal of the European Communities.

It shall apply until 31 December 1983.

Whereas, in accordance with the procedure provided for by the Fisheries Agreement between the European Economic Community, of the one part, and the Government of Denmark and the Home Government of the Faroe Islands, of the other part, both parties have held consultations concerning their mutual fishing rights for 1983.

Whereas as a result of these consultations the two parties have agreed an arrangement for 1983 involving *inter alia* the allocation of certain catch quotas to Community vessels in the fisheries zone of the Faroe Islands;

Whereas it is the responsibility of the Community to allocate the catch quotas in the fisheries zone of the Faroe Islands among fishermen from the Community;

Whereas, in order to ensure an equitable allocation of available fishing possibilities, these quotas

should be allocated among the Member States of the Community;

Whereas information about actual catches should be made available in order to ensure that this allocation is respected,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

From 1 January to 31 December 1983, catches by vessels flying the flag of a Member State in the waters falling within the fisheries jurisdiction of the Faroe Islands under the arrangement on reciprocal fishing rights for 1983 between Community and the Faroe Islands shall be limited to the quotas set out in the Annex.

Article 2

Member States and captains of fishing vessels flying the flag of a Member State shall, with regard to fishing in the waters referred to in Article 1, comply with the provisions of Articles 3 to 9 of Council Regulation (EEC) No 2057/82 of 29 June 1982 establishing certain control measures for fishing activities by vessels of the Member States (3).

Article 3

This Regulation shall enter into force on the day of its publication in the Official Journal of the European Communities.

It shall apply until 31 December 1983.
